We hope to welcome you to experience *The Warwick Way* for yourself soon.

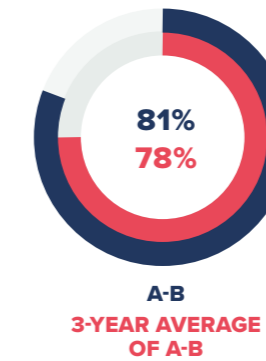
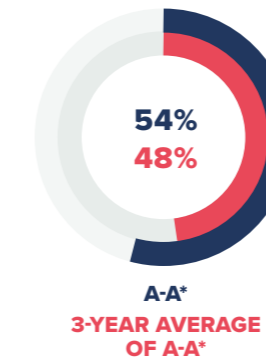
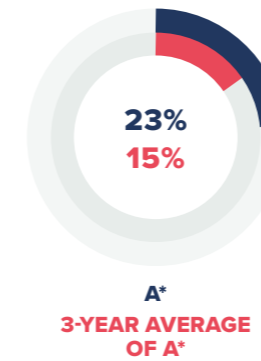

Boarding at Warwick

For boys who choose to board at Warwick, the School has accommodation for 60 boarders in our beautiful boarding house, School House.

Modern and comfortable accommodation provides a home from home, supported by a specialist staff of house parents, tutors and domestic staff. The house provides excellent support structures to boarders from overseas, new to studying in England, which enables them to settle very quickly into life away from home.

School House is run by resident house parents with an assistant house parent.

Home to pupils from age 13-18 (Year 9 - Year 13), there are a number of single rooms for those in Year 13, otherwise our rooms have two or three boarders sharing together. School House is in the beautiful surroundings of the main historic Warwick School building and has modern

bathroom facilities, social spaces and WiFi throughout.

Catering

All meals are taken in the main dining hall. The Food Committee, which is made up of boys in each year group, meet regularly with the Head Chef to select varied and nutritious menus for the boarders.

In addition, senior boys also have their own kitchen in which they can prepare occasional meals, light snacks and drinks.

Boarders are also encouraged to visit the local shops to buy provisions for themselves and have access to a range of supermarkets.

School life

Our boarders fit in seamlessly with our day pupils here at Warwick, and equally form the

fabric of our community. From learning and socialising with the day pupils throughout the school day, to staying on the campus when the day has finished to relax and enjoy the boarding facilities, our boarders will truly feel the warmth of the Warwick community.

At Warwick School, boarders enjoy numerous activities, events and trips through the week. Each year we aim to accommodate the interests and suggestions of the pupils so that activities and excursions are well attended. Boarders learn to manage their time effectively and achieve a healthy balance between study and leisure time.

Boarding at King's High School

The girls' boarding house, Way House, provides comfortable, 'home from home', family-like accommodation for our boarders. It is carefully styled to provide modern and homely accommodation in what is a beautiful heritage building, with high ceilings and large windows.

Bedrooms are spacious and double occupancy. In addition to comfortable study bedrooms, Way House has its own sitting room, where the girls can relax, socialise, and catch up on events from their day. A boarders' kitchen, along with bathrooms, complete the accommodation.

Adding to the warmth of our boarding community, we're delighted to welcome Moose, an adorable Australian Shepherd

puppy, who joins our much-loved school dog, Parsnip. Moose lives with Molly Lane, our Assistant House Parent and Wellbeing Mentor, in the King's High Boarding House - Way House - which is managed by Kirsten Cooper, our House Mistress. Moose is already becoming a familiar and much-loved face around school, always ready for a cuddle or some fun!

For breakfast and dinner, the whole boarding community comes together to eat in the

Warwick School dining room. Lunch is served with the entire school community in the King's High dining hall.

Our boarding experience for girls mirrors the experience across our Warwick campus: a single-sex boarding house with opportunities to enjoy social activities with the boy boarders of Warwick School.



Location

King's High School and Warwick School are uniquely situated between two culturally rich and historic British towns – Warwick and Royal Leamington Spa.

Both are within walking distance, offering students immediate access to iconic landmarks such as the world-renowned Warwick Castle and the elegant Georgian architecture of Royal Leamington Spa.

These towns are not only steeped in tradition and heritage, but also rank among the top 10% of UK areas for household income – making them some of the most desirable and affluent communities in the country.

Warwick was recognised as the highest-ranked Midlands town in The Times and The Sunday Times' 'Best Places to Live' list, securing the 21st position overall.

During their free time, pupils who board at the schools can explore the school facilities or venture further afield into Warwick. The Georgian town of Royal Leamington Spa, with its extensive shopping opportunities, is a short bus or bike ride away. Older pupils can travel by public transport to nearby cities and visit friends and family all over the country.

Major cities and towns are also within easy reach. You can reach the capital London within 90 minutes and the UK's second city, Birmingham, within 30 minutes by train.

A coach transfer service is available to and from Heathrow Airport for the main holidays.

Entry requirements

To ensure that pupils meet the academic criteria at our schools, they are required to take entrance exams. If living abroad, it is possible to arrange for entrance exams to take place in a pupil's current school should the Head of the school be in agreement, or at a British Council office or an approved agent of Warwick Schools Foundation.

Admissions process

To enquire about a place, please send the pupil's full name, date of birth and last two school reports to us.

If we are satisfied, we will invite the pupil to register. On receiving the registration form and registration payment, we will contact you to arrange:

- Assessment papers (in Maths and English)
- An interview with the Head of Boarding or Head Master.

On review of the above assessments, we will be able to determine if we are able to make an offer. Please note that a nonrefundable deposit of half a term's tuition and boarding fee is required on acceptance of the offer.

Fees

Please see our websites for current fees. Extras for boarders include:

- A small charge made for school and boarding house trips and excursions – parents are billed every term for these
- Return transfers to the airport at the beginning and end of term
- Phone calls made using the school's landline phones.

English as an Additional Language (EAL)

At our schools, extra tuition is offered to boarders for whom English is a foreign language to help improve their English skills. The EAL Department has an expert team of highly qualified and experienced teachers.

Pupils whose English reaches near-native proficiency are eligible for transfer to mainstream English classes, with pupils being considered on an individual basis.

There is no additional cost for EAL tuition.
